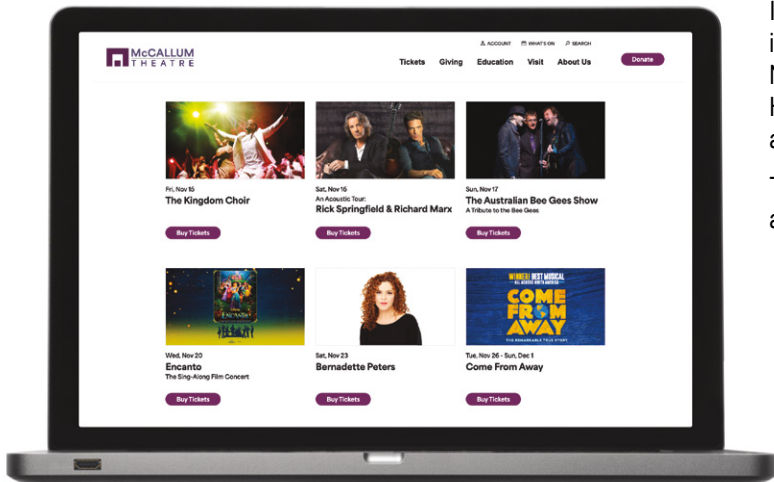
E-tickets – these are electronic tickets in the form of a QR code. They will be made available to you 48 hours prior to each event.
